

CLP Hazard Labelling Advice for Consumer Products

This advice relates to labelling rules under the Classification, Labelling and Packaging of Substances and Mixtures Regulation (EC) No 1272/2008 (CLP Regulations). Although most parts of the CLP regulations are mandated, some aspects, such as precautionary information, relate to the use of the product and the intended user and therefore some interpretation is required. The interpretation applied here relates to consumer use and follow official guidance.

Please note this advice relates to use at the specified concentration in a non-hazardous base, and using containers and or packaging which do not give additional labelling requirements (such as aerosols).

PRODUCT: SILKY SAKURA FRAGRANCE OIL (5% IN ETHANOL/PERFUMERS ALCOHOL)

For advisory labelling purposes only, we advise that the product above can be labelled as shown:



PRODUCT IDENTIFIER: SILKY SAKURA FRAGRANCE OIL (5% IN ETHANOL/PERFUMERS ALCOHOL)

SIGNAL WORD: Danger

HAZARD STATEMENTS IF PACK SIZE IS <125ML: NONE

HAZARD STATEMENTS IF PACK SIZE IS >125ML: Highly flammable liquid and vapour. Causes serious eye irritation.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS: Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames and hot surfaces. - No smoking. Keep container tightly closed. Wash hands and other contacted skin thoroughly after handling. Wear protective gloves/eye protection/face protection. IF ON SKIN (or hair): Remove/take off immediately all contaminated clothing. Rinse skin with water/shower. IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention. In case of fire: Use carbon dioxide, dry chemical, foam for extinction. Store in a well-ventilated place. Keep cool. Dispose of contents/container to approved disposal site, in accordance with local regulations.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION: Contains d-Limonene. May produce an allergic reaction.
